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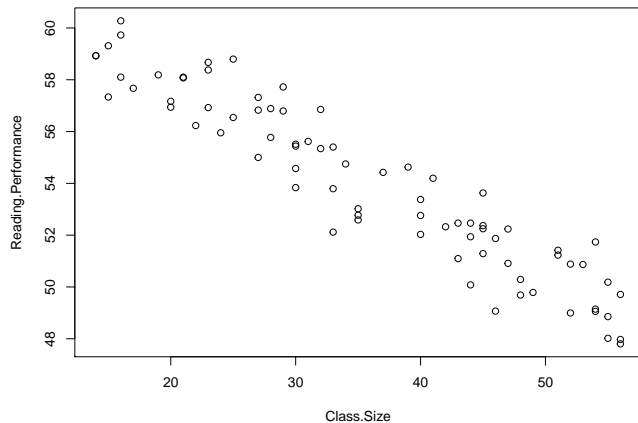

A Bivariate Relationship

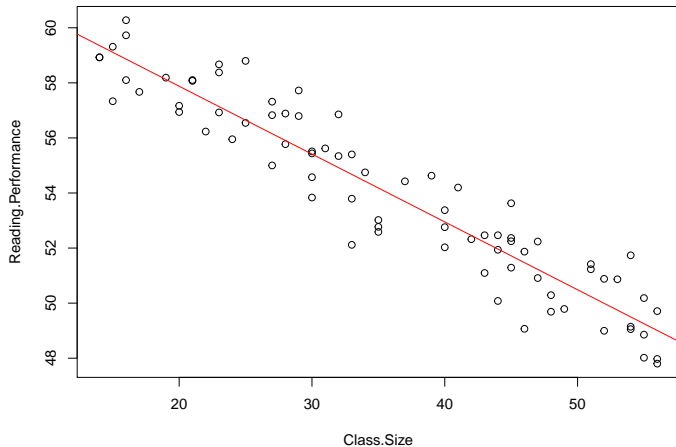
Class Size vs. Reading Performance

Is the model **Perfect?**

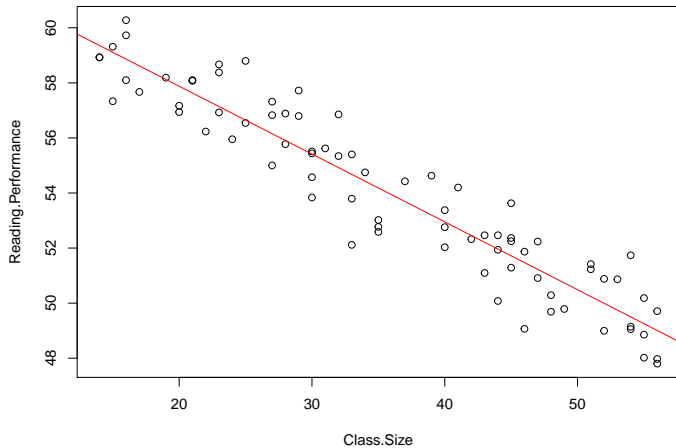
$$\text{Data} = \text{Model} + \text{Error}$$
